

Good morning everyone, I hope you and your family are safe and doing well.

Last night the Senate and House of Representatives passed the \$900 billion COVID relief bill. <u>The full bill can be read here.</u>

Below are the highlights of the bill that I think are most relevant.

## Individuals

- \$600 stimulus payment to individuals making up to \$75,000 per year, and \$1,200 for married couples making up to \$150,000 per year.
- \$600 stimulus payment for each dependent child.
- \$300 per week unemployment supplement from December 26<sup>th</sup> until March 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

## **Business**

- Extends the employee retention tax credit
- Temporarily allows a 100% business expense deduction for meals if the food or beverages are provided by a restaurant. This provision is effective for expenses incurred after December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020 and expires at the end of 2022.
- Reinstatement of the PPP program for first and second PPP forgivable small business loans.
- Simplified PPP forgiveness application for loans of \$150,000 or less.
- Tax deductibility for PPP expenses.
- Reinstatement of EIDL Grants to businesses in low-income communities.

I will create a separate email that goes into more detail for the PPP provisions. Please understand that this is just a summary of the items I feel are most relevant. There are many provisions that have not been covered here.
